“FUNERAL ARRANGEMENTS”

There's nothing quite like doing advanced funeral planning to make it all very real. It's what some would call a “come to Jesus moment,” and I'd recommend it for anyone.

First, there are the practical reasons. When death happens, there's a crush of decisions to be made, decisions the family often finds simply overwhelming. Hasty decisions are usually not our best decisions, financially or otherwise. Advanced planning makes the burden on everyone much easier.

But there are also good spiritual reasons for making advanced funeral arrangements. There's no glossing over the reality of your prospects while calling the funeral home to ask for an appointment. There's no whistling your way past the cemetery while choosing where your remains will be buried. There's no ignoring death while looking at a digital mockup of your headstone.

Coming to terms with death while yet living is good and healthy. Otherwise, we would not be inclined to give death its due. We are more inclined to ignore death, make light of it, and make no preparations for it. Therefore, when death finally catches up, many find themselves unprepared.

The Good News is God has been preparing for your funeral for a very long time! Long before the earth was ever formed, in his foreknowledge he knew death was going to be a problem for you, in fact your greatest problem. He knew you would need one who would save you from death, one who would take on your sin and pay the costly ransom for it. Therefore, in his great mercy, and long before you were even born, he came to defang death and rob it of its victory over you. In Jesus' death and resurrection, God has done the lion's share of preparing for your funeral. Whatever's left to do is ultimately inconsequential. Whether your casket is made of steel or wood or compressed cardboard won't make a bit of difference in terms of your salvation. In Christ, that part is already taken care of, already paid for!

As I write this, Gail and I are making final arrangements for a headstone. In preparation, I went for a little walk through the cemetery to consider the old and new options and take pictures for consideration. While I was out there, my brother Paul called and asked what I was up to. I told him: “looking into headstones.” As soon as the words came out of my mouth, I realized how morbid they must have sounded, and indeed, Paul was quick to express sorrow. I replied, “It's really not that bad. It's sort of like diving into a Wisconsin lake: at first, it's shockingly cold, but then you adjust.” Besides, it was a beautiful day out there. The birds were singing, the earth was warming, and there were a few early signs of Spring. Just in case I missed the point, and there were plenty of reminders chiseled into stone, such as, “I know my Redeemer lives” and “I shall

dwell in the house of the Lord forever.”

Because of God’s advanced planning . . . because of Christ, we have nothing to fear, and no reason to avoid making a few preparations ourselves.

“MEDICATION ISN’T ALWAYS THE ANSWER”

Many illnesses are treated with medication, but perhaps that shouldn't be the first choice. For many illnesses, walking could be the first prescription. You heard that right—read on.

A 2016 report from the National Heart, Lung and Blood Institute found that walking reduces your risk for coronary artery disease. Walking can also reduce high blood pressure and cholesterol. Aim for a mile or more every day. Start with a distance you're comfortable with and work up to a longer faster pace. Any walking is beneficial.

A leisurely pace can help arthritis. It strengthens your muscles which support your joints and decreases joint stiffness. Walking can be as beneficial as anti-inflammatory drugs like ibuprofen to reduce pain.

Walking also reduces osteoporosis. The impact of every step can strengthen the bones. A daily 30-minute walk can be very beneficial, but breaking that down into several shorter walks per day is just as good.

A nice brisk walk also helps depression as it increases serotonin and dopamine which make you feel better.

Insomnia can respond to a walk in morning's bright light and again in late afternoon/early evening as our bodies begin to slow down for the day. A walk for 15-30 minutes is sufficient.

Type 2 diabetes also responds to walking. A 15-minute easy pace walk after every meal can help control blood sugar and reduce bloods sugar spikes. Diabetics must be mindful of good foot care and appropriate socks and walking shoes.

Spring is here. It's a perfect time to begin a walking program for yourself and your family. Pace yourself in the beginning to avoid any injuries or sore muscles. Enjoy the sun and reawakening of lawns, trees and flowers. The birds are fun too! Enjoy your strolls alone or consider walking with friends or family. It's never too early to get your children on a path to better health also. There is also a Walk on Saturday program at 9 AM. Watch the Daily Times to see where the group is meeting and try a new path every week! You are on a path to better health!

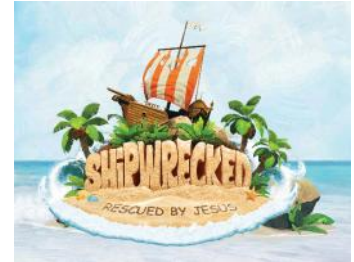
