FROM THE PASTOR

“WE MUST ALWAYS TAKE SIDES”

The year was 1982. I was in high school, and my family was applying to host a foreign exchange student. Part of the application process was to meet and greet the previous year's exchange students, each of which gave a presentation about their home country. One of the students was from Sweden. He was big-boned, tall and barrel-chested. He was a very proud young man. He was particularly proud of Sweden's historic neutrality, and talked at length about the virtues of neutrality. (Sweden did not participate in World War I or World War II.)

It's funny the things you remember, but I can still see the man sitting directly in front of me. He was in his sixties with white hair closely cropped. He was a small man, lean, wiry, and had fine lines in the back of his tanned neck. Everyone in the small town of Delavan knew he had fought in the European theater of World War II.

As the Swedish student went on about the merits of neutrality, the man in front of me was growing physically agitated, shifting repeatedly in his seat. He could not get comfortable. His neck grew a darker shade of red. Clearly, he had something to say and was trying to hold it in. But he could not. He interrupted the young Swede and said, "Sometimes you have to stand up to and confront evil in order to stop it!" I don't recall what the big Swede said in response. I only recall how relieved he was to field a soft, easy question from someone else in the crowd.

"Sometimes you have to stand up to and confront evil in order to stop it." It's true in international relations. It's also true at the local level. (I'm thinking of the human trafficking going on in our area, particularly in and around the strip joints.) It's also true as individuals. The 8th commandment forbids us from slandering another person, which is easy to do, especially when we have a grievance. But it's just as easy to break the 8th commandment with our silence and neutrality, for example when we are not speaking up for or defending the one who's being slandered. Our silence is assent. Our silence gives the nod of approval. Our silence is like Saul watching over the cloaks of those who were stoning Stephen (Acts 7:54-60). Proverbs 31 says, "Speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves, for the rights of all who are destitute. Open your mouth, judge fairly; defend the rights of the poor and needy" (vv. 8-9).

Elie Wiesel was a Holocaust survivor who won the 1986 Nobel Peace Prize. In his acceptance speech, he writes, "I remember: it happened yesterday or eternities ago. A

young Jewish boy discovered the kingdom of night. I remember his bewilderment, I remember his anguish. It all happened so fast. The ghetto. The deportation. The sealed cattle car. The fiery altar . . . I remember: he asked his father: ‘Can this be true?’ This is the twentieth century, not the Middle Ages. Who would allow such crimes to be committed? How could the world remain silent? . . . I swore never to be silent whenever and wherever human beings endure suffering and humiliation. We must always take sides. Neutrality helps the oppressor, never the victim. Silence encourages the tormentor, never the tormented. Sometimes we must interfere. When human lives are endangered, when human dignity is in jeopardy, national borders and sensitivities become irrelevant. Wherever men or women are persecuted because of their race, religion, or political views, that place must – at that moment – become the center of the universe” (Quoted from WSJ 7/4/16).

I write this shortly before Memorial Day Weekend, grateful to God for those who have stood up to evil, and grateful to all those who are willing to do so today. I write this grateful also to God’s Son Jesus who stood up to our oppressors of sin, death and the devil.

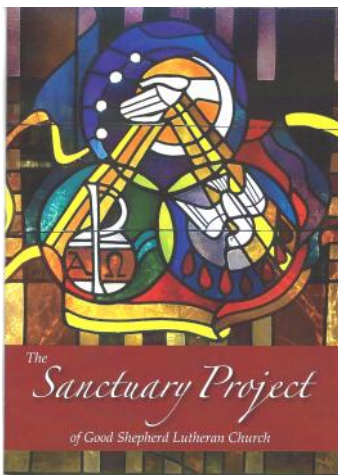
This couple was devastated when they heard the main campus of Bethesda (including the chapel) was going to be torn down; but they were also delighted to learn we were going to receive the beautiful stained glass windows from Bethesda.

One day last year fall, this couple asked to see me immediately after a Saturday evening service. We sat down in my office and she told me a story I will not soon forget. She told me they’d been married for 53 years, and over this entire time they used a simple but effective way to manage their expenses. Every pay period, the husband gave his wife a sum of cash to pay for their groceries. Anything she did not spend, she put in a paper bag, and stored that paper bag in the cedar chest. Again, she told me, “I did this for over 50 years of marriage!”

The wife then opened up her big purse, and pulled out a well rumpled brown paper bag with numerous rubber bands holding it in a bundle. “Here’s the leftovers! It’s for the windows!” she said excitedly. “It’s not gaining any interest in the cedar chest, and we wanted to do something good with it.” In the bag was over \$6,000 in small, old bills!

At this point, the husband laughed heartily and said, “I didn’t even know about this until last week! For 53 years she kept this a secret!”

Again, these are not members of Good Shepherd, but are friends of Good Shepherd with deep roots at Bethesda. And they are so happy to support this project!

“STOP THE FIGHTING”

The following excerpt comes from a Lutheran Hour Ministries Devotion from January 22, 2018:

“Now in this world I can think of a number of places you want to see peace and harmony and no conflict or dissension. For example,

- *You don't want to see surgeons fighting before they operate on you.*
- *You don't want to see personnel fighting while they pack your parachute before a jump.*
- *You don't want to see pilots fighting while the plane is in the air.”*

As I read this I mentally added my own bullet point

- And I don't want to see God's littler people fighting at our school. Ever.

Many times prospective parents come to visit Good Shepherd and ask the question, “How do you handle discipline?” I tell them the truth. While we first apply Love and Logic program practices to negative situations (which help children learn accountability) we go a step further to follow it with Christian practices. We work together to get to the root of the problem and talk things out. We are honest with each other about our actions and our feelings, and then we work for a solution, ending with forgiveness granted.

Just like all of the given examples make people lose faith in the workers listed above, how we resolve our differences, whether it's a playground fight over 4-square or nasty rumors being spread, can give people faith that honors our Savior in a God-pleasing way.

Colossians 3:12-13 “Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience, bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive.”

As a former GSLS student once said to another (struggling to be truthful) in my office, “You might as well just give it up. Ms. Gromowski loves us enough, whether we like it or not, to spend her entire day making this right between us.” What a blessing, joy, and opportunity we have to stop the fighting and restore faith in each other through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

PARISH NURSE HEALTH NOTE

“STAY HEALTHY THIS SUMMER”

The Wisconsin Dept. of Health Services released some important summer health concerns 5/07/18. They strongly encourage all of us to avoid tick and mosquito bites.

Ticks can transmit Lyme Disease and mosquitoes can transmit the West Nile virus. Wisconsin is in the top 20% of states with tick-borne disease. There were 4,299 cases of Lyme disease in WI in 2017. There were also 51 cases of West Nile virus in WI. Certain dead birds can be an indication of West Nile. NEVER touch sick or dead birds-report them to 1-800-433-1610 the WI Hotline.

Ticks and mosquitoes are not only annoying, but can be deadly! What to do:

- *Use EPA-approved repellent according to label directions
- *Wear light-colored long-sleeved shirts and long pants
- *Use permethrin-treated clothing
- *Control ticks on pets
- *Check our body for ticks after outings in woods or long grass-remove safely
- *Control mosquitoes outside your home-check for standing water

SANDWICHES IN THE PARK— HELP WITH SUPPLIES NEEDED



Summer will soon be here – at least according to the calendar. We are starting to gear up for Sandwiches in the Park which will be every Friday starting June 15 and running through August 24.

Bag lunches that we provide for families with children include the choice of a meat, cheese, or peanut butter sandwich, fresh vegetables (finger food), fresh fruit or fruit cup, a snack item (cookies, granola bars, pretzels, etc.), white or chocolate milk (100% fruit juice if not able to drink milk) and yogurt sticks or frozen pops.

In order to help with supplies, the Giving Tree will be set up for items such as creamy peanut butter, grape and strawberry jelly, paper towels, napkins, brown lunch paper bags (large size), disposable wash cloths and Zip Lock sandwich bags (we need a lot of them each week – 1 for a sandwich, 1 for fruit, 1 for vegetables, and maybe 1 for snacks – so we really can't have too many when figuring 11 weeks averaging 80-90 lunches per week).

Bread and buns will again be provided by Brownberry Ovens delivered by Dr. Dan Lapin once a week for all three churches involved. We need to purchase meat, milk, fruit and vegetables every week so monetary donations would also be appreciated.

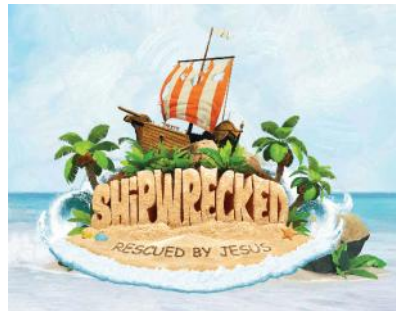
KINGDOM QUEST – EXPLORING GOD’S KINGDOM THROUGH SUNDAY SCHOOL


